No. 32.

Resolution in relation to the payment of Newspapers.

Passed March
7, 1845.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the State pay to George G. Brewer, chief clerk of the House of Delegates, and Joseph H. Nicholson, chief clerk of the Senate, out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, the amount of the several accounts that may from time to time be presented to him by said clerks, for newspapers furnished the members of the Legislature during the present session, and the members of the Senate during the last session, and that he also pay the amount for postage upon letters forwarded and received by said clerks, relative to the duties of their respective offices.

No. 33.

Resolution requiring the Directors on the part of the State in the several works of Internal Improvement, to investigate the affairs of said companies, and to affect such retrenchment as may be practicable and proper.

Passed March
10, 1845.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the directors on the part of the State in the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company, and other works of internal improvement, be and they are hereby directed to investigate the affairs of said companies, and report thereon to the next Legislature; and also to enquire whether the salaries of officers and other expenses of said companies cannot be reduced with advantage to the State; and to exert their power and influence to effect such retrenchment as may be practicable and proper.

Resolution appropriating a certain sum for defraying the Contingent Expenses of the State.

8, 1845.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sum of five thousand dollars be, and they are hereby appropriated to defray the contingent expenses of the State, for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five,
