CHAPTER 64.

An act to allow John M. Carlton, late Sheriff and Collector of fees of Allegany County, further time to complete 6, 1845.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That John M. Carlton, late sheriff and collector of fees of Allegany county, by himself or any person or persons by him appointed for this purpose, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to collect until the last day of December, eighteen hundred and forty-six, all sums and balances due him as sheriff and collector of fees of Allegany county, in the same manner which the said John M. Carlton, late sheriff and collector of fees of Allegany county, could or might have done within the time limited by law, any thing to the contrary notwithstanding.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty Thirty days. of the said John M. Carlton, before he proceeds to execute or distrain the property of any person or persons for public dues or officer's fees in virtue of this act, to deliver to such person or persons chargeable with the same, at least thirty days previous to the levying such execution or distress, an account written in words in full length of the taxes, public dues, or officer's fees, demanded of him, her or them, with an affidavit annexed thereto, that he hath not received any part thereof, nor any thing in security or satisfaction for the same, more than the credits given, to the best of his knowledge.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Time allowed. That the time allowed by law to Morris O. Colston, col-
