CHAPTER 78. CHAP. 80.

An act relating to Contested Elections.

Passed Feb. 14, 1845.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Persons contact after this session, it shall not be lawful to allow any not allowed That after this session, it shall not be lawful to allow any not individual contesting the seat of any one who has been reg. per diem, &c. ularly returned by the judges of election, as elected to a seat in either branch of the legislature, any per diem, mileage or other pay, unless the party so contesting shall establish his right to such seat.

CHAPTER 79.

An act to make valid a Deed from Richard Dorsey and Passed Feb. wife, to Daniel Lamboon.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Deed made That the deed from Richard Dorsey and Elizabeth Dor. valid. sey, his wife, of the city of Baltimore, to Daniel Lamboon, of Anne Arundel county, bearing date the tenth day of October, one thousand, eight hundred and thirty-four, and recorded among the land records of Anne Arundel county, in liber W. S. G., number nineteen, folios five hundred and thirty-four and five hundred and thirty five, be and the same is hereby made as valid and effectual in law, as if the certificate of the clerk of Baltimore county court had been annexed thereto, declaring that the justices of the peace, before whom the acknowledgment of said deed was taken, were then in commission, and duly authorised to act as justices in and for the city of Baltimore.
