

CHAP. 102. all fines, forfeitures, amercements, officer's fees, county charges and public dues, which were placed in his hands for collection, and which have not been collected in the same manner as he could or might have done within the time limited by law.

CHAPTER 101.

Passed Feb. 18, 1845. *An act to provide for the more equal distribution of the State's donation to Academies in Carroll County.*

Treasurer to pay annually to academies.

SECTION I. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay annually to the following academies in Carroll county, out of the State's donation for the benefit of academies in said county, viz: to the Manchester academy, one hundred and fifty dollars, to the Carroli academy, one hundred and twenty-five dollars, to the Uniontown academy, one hundred and twenty-five dollars, to the Taney town academy, one hundred dollars, to the Clover Hill academy, one hundred dollars, to the Deer Park academy, one hundred dollars, and to the Freedom academy, one hundred dollars.

Treasurer to pay the money to the trustees.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said Treasurer is hereby authorised and required to pay the aforesaid sums of money to the trustees of said academies respectively, from time to time, or to their order as provided for by this act; *provided,* said trustees comply with the requisitions of the several acts of Assembly, prescribing certain duties to the trustees of academies and colleges receiving donations from the State.

Proviso.

Repealed.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That all acts so far as they are inconsistent with this act, be and the same are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 102.

Passed Feb. 19, 1845. *An act authorising Mary De Cormis, of the City of Baltimore, to bring into this State, a negro slave from Virginia, named Georgiana.*

Bring into this State a negro slave.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for Mary De Cormis, of the city of Balti-
