CHAPTER 19.

*An act entitled, a further supplement to an act passed December session eighteen hundred and forty-three, chapter thirty-two, for the benefit of Julia Ann Garner, of Carroll county, Maryland.*

Passed Jan. 14, 1846.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the commissioners of the tax of Carroll county, be and they are hereby authorized to levy annually a further sum not exceeding fifty dollars for the benefit and support of Julia Ann Garner, and cause the same to be paid over to Edmund Garner for the use of said Julia Ann Garner.

CHAPTER 20.

*An act for the incorporation of Howard Division, Number Three, of the Sons of Temperance of the city of Baltimore and State of Maryland.*

Roche, officers and members of Howard Division, Number Three, of the Sons of Temperance of the city of Baltimore and State of Maryland, and their successors, be and are hereby incorporated and made a body politic and corporate by the name and number of "Howard Division, Number Three, of the Sons of Temperance of the city of Baltimore, and State of Maryland," and by that name may sue and be
