SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall be considered in full force and virtue, as soon as the President and Directors of the Commercial and Farmers' Bank of Baltimore aforesaid, shall by resolution authorised at a general meeting of the stockholders, to be called for that purpose, declare their acceptance thereof, and transmit to the Treasurer of the State, a copy of said resolution, certified under the seal of the corporation.

CHAPTER 261.

*A supplement to the act of eighteen hundred and thirty-one, chapter three hundred and sixteen, entitled, an act relating to Insolvent Debtors.*

*An act to incorporate the Patapsco Division, Number Eleven, of the Sons of Temperance, of the State of Maryland.*
