Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Incorporated. Maryland, That Horace Capron, Osmond C. Tiffany, William E. Mayhew, Benjamin C. Ward and Stephen B. Heath, be and they are hereby made and constituted a body corporate and politic, by the name of the Laurel Manufacturing Company, and as such shall have succession, and may sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in any court of law or equity, and may have and use a common seal, and the same may change and alter at pleasure, and shall have and exercise all the powers, rights and privileges which are necessary and proper for manufacturing cotton, iron and other articles, and vending the same; and for the aforesaid purposes, may purchase, hold and use lands, not exceeding five hundred acres in quantity, and erect thereon such buildings and improvements as may be deemed necessary or expedient.
