Bosley and wife to Edward Gorsuch and others as trustees, by deed bearing date twenty-fifth day of February, eighteen hundred and thirty-four, and recorded in Baltimore county court as will appear, for the sole use and benefit of said church, according to the true intent and meaning of the said deed of trust.

An act to repeal an act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and forty-three, chapter two hundred and ninety-five, relating to the holding of elections in the Third Election District, in Carroll County.

Passed Mar. 9, 1846.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and forty-three, chapter two hundred and ninety-five, relating to the holding of elections in the third election district, in Carroll county, be and the same is hereby repealed; and that all future elections shall be held at the tavern house now occupied by Peter E. Myers, in said district.
