WHEREAS, the present mode of indexing judgments by Preamble. the clerk of Washington county court, is in the name of the first named defendant on the record, and judgments superseded are not in any manner indexed against the superseders in said judgments, which is calculated to injure purchasers and disturb titles, to remedy which,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Clerk to enter names of de-Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, fendants. whenever a judgment is rendered in said court, it shall be the duty of the clerk of said court to enter upon his index, to be kept for that purpose, the names of all the defendants against whom said judgments have been rendered.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That whenever a judg-names of sument rendered in said court, shall be super-seded, it shall perseders. be the duty of the clerk of said court to index the names of all persons superseding the same.

SEC. 3.
