No. 24.

Resolution requesting the Governor to cause the Flag to be hoisted on the twenty-second of February, eighteen hundred and forty-six, &c. Passed Feb. 21, 1846.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor be requested to cause the flag to be hoisted on the dome of the State House, and a National salute to be fired on Monday next, in commemoration of the birth of the illustrious Washington, and annually hereafter, whenever the twenty-second day of February shall fall on Sunday, then the flag shall be hoisted and the salute fired on the next day.

No. 25.

Preamble and Resolution in favor of William Hamilton, to allow him a credit for Coupons destroyed by fire. Passed Feb. 21, 1846.

WHEREAS, it has been represented to the General Assembly of Maryland, that a certain William Hamilton, of Charles county, had consumed in his dwelling house which was destroyed by fire, coupons of interest amounting to the sum of forty-eight dollars—therefore,

Be it resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the collector of the State tax for Charles county, is hereby required to give a receipt for the amount of coupons thus destroyed by fire, to the said William Hamilton, as for so much State tax by him paid; and the Treasurer of the State is required to credit the said collector in his returns for the amount of coupons thus received for by him.
