## No. 29.

Preamble and resolution in favor of the Clerk to the Treasurer of the State. Passed Feb. 26, 1846.

WHEREAS, the great increase of business which within the last few years has been thrown upon the Treasury will require the services of a second clerk, or that the present one, whose intimate acquaintance with, and untiring devotion to the duties of his office strongly recommend to the favorable notice of the legislature, should often work at night. And as the salary now received by the clerk is a very inadequate compensation for the services performed by him and affords but a very scant support to his family, and may be increased to an amount which would satisfy him without imposing any additional charge on the Treasury, and be but a fair compensation for services rendered in keeping the accounts of that branch of revenue—therefore,

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Treasurer be, and he hereby is required to pay annually in quarterly payments to his clerk the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, out of the proceeds of the States' tobacco inspection, as a further compensation for his services, commencing from the first January, eighteen hundred and forty-six.
