Resolution instructing the Treasurer to pay the Chief Clerk of the Senate and House of Delegates, such sums of money as may be necessary to pay the accounts for furnishing members of the Legislature with newspapers.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the State pay to George G. Brewer, chief clerk of the House of Delegates, and Joseph H. Nicholson, chief clerk of the Senate, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the amount of the several accounts that may from time to time be presented to them by said clerks, for newspapers furnished the members of the legislature during the present session, and that he also pay the amount for postage upon letters forwarded and received by said clerks, relative to the duties of their respective offices.
