chair one do one CHAPTER 187. The sections and sections best Passed March An act to authorise and require the Orphans Court of Baltimore County to give preference to County Business on Wednesday and Saturday in each and every Week.

Preference to county business.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Ascembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, it shall be the duty of the judges of the orphans court of Baltimore county, and they are hereby required to give preference to all county business that may come before them for their action, on each and every Wednesday and Saturday, in each and every week, any law or arrangement of said court to the contrary notwithstanding.

Time of business.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That said orphans court shall hold their session from ten o'clock in the forenoon, until three o'clock in the afternoon, every Wednesday and Saturday, in each and every week, for the transaction of county business; provided, there should be no county business on those days aforesaid, they can proceed with city business; and provided further, nothing in this act is meant or intended to prevent said court from acting on county business any other day in the week.

Repealed.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That any act or parts of acts conflicting with this act be, and the same are hereby repealed.
