CHAP. 211.

An act to incorporate the Middletown Horse Guards.

Passed March 4, 1847.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, Samuel Bowles, Hezekiah Floyd, Richard J. Lamar, William H. Creager and others, who are or may hereafter become members of a volunteer corps of cavalry, recently organized in Frederick county, in this State; and their successors be, and they are hereby declared to be a body corporate by the name, style and title of the Middletown Horse Guards, and by that name may hold real and personal property, not exceeding in value the sum of two thousand dollars, current money, exclusive of the arms and equipments of the said company.

Incorporated.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the said company and their successors, by the aforesaid name, shall be capable in law to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, answer and be answered, defend and be defended, in all and every court of justice whatsoever, and before any judge or justice in all and singular actions and demands, and to ordain, establish and enforce such by-laws, ordinances and regulations, as to them shall seem conducive to the interest of said company, and necessary to the good government and management thereof, not being contrary to the existing laws of this State, or of the United States.

May make by laws.

Issues forbid.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That nothing therein contained, shall be so construed as to authorize or empower said corporation to issue any notes, tokens or certificates, or evidence of debt, to be used as a currency, and that nothing herein contained, shall be so construed as to deny the right of this General Assembly of Maryland to repeal or modify this act at its pleasure.
