

CHAP. 218. not less than five days from the day of the issue shall be issued; and if then the tenant, his executors or administrators shall not be found to have service made, a copy of said second summons shall be left with the occupants of the premises; or, if they be vacant, affixed to some principal building on the premises, or otherwise then set up if there be no building; and thereupon, on the day assigned in the summons for the appearance, the justice shall proceed as if the parties to be summoned had appeared.

CHAPTER 218.

Passed March 5, 1847.

An act entitled, an act to elect the Treasurer of Baltimore County by the People.

Treasurer of Balt. county elected by the people.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the legal voters of Baltimore county shall be, and are hereby authorised and empowered, at the next general election to be held in said county, and at each general election thereafter to be held therein, to elect by ballot a Treasurer for said county, who shall also act as clerk to the commissioners of said county, and receive as compensation for his services as treasurer and clerk, such sums as the commissioners of Baltimore county may deem reasonable and right, not exceeding five hundred dollars per annum.

Treasurer to take an oath.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said treasurer and clerk, before he proceeds to act as such, shall take an oath in due form of law, faithfully to perform the duties devolving upon him as such treasurer and clerk, and in addition, the said treasurer shall enter into a good and sufficient bond and security, to be approved by the commissioners of Baltimore county, for the faithful performance of his duties as treasurer, in a penalty not less, in any case, than the amount of the annual levy for the term for which he may be elected.

Office hours.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the said treasurer and clerk shall keep his office open for the transaction of business from nine o'clock in the morning, until three, each day, Sunday excepted.

In case of death, &c.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That in cases of the death or resignation of the said treasurer at any time during the term for which he shall have been elected to serve, then and in such case it shall be, and is hereby made
