the administration of said trust estate, or the compensation received by them since the last annual report or statement; and should the said trustees or their agent fail to make such annual report or statement, where compensation is received by them, they shall be thenceforth subject to the operation of the aforesaid act of eighteen hundred and forty-five, chapter one hundred and sixtysix; and the failure of the said trustees to make such annual report or statement, where compensation is received by them, shall be deemed and taken to be a breach of the condition of the aforesaid bond, and upon suit brought thereon, judgment shall be rendered for the

Patterson, John Easter, John Russell, Jr., Michael Cornell, Lyander W. Webb, John W. Fisher, Henry Sinclair, William H. Shipley, James J.
