SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That any constable or
 justice of the peace, who shall fail to execute this law
 upon information as hereinbefore provided, such con-
 stable or justice so offending shall be liable to indict-
 ment, and upon conviction, shall be removed from office,
 and may be fined as for a misdemeanor. Liable to in-
dictment.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the parent of any such
 child or children shall have the privilege of selecting the
 person to whom his or her child may be bound; *provided*,
 the orphans court or justices of the peace before whom
 such child shall be taken, shall approve of such selection. Parent to se-
lect person.
Proviso.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That any person to whom
 any apprentice may be bound under the original act, or
 this supplement, shall not permit such apprentice to re-
 main in the employment or custody of any free negro or
 mulatto, and any masters so offending, shall be liable to
 indictment and punishment as for a misdemeanor.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That all acts inconsistent
 with the provisions of this act be, and the same are
 hereby repealed. Repealed.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall extend
 to, and be in operation in Harford county only; *provided*
however, that nothing in this act shall be so construed so
 as to repeal the sixth section of the act to which this is
 a supplement, but the same shall be taken and considered
 as a part of this act. In Harford
county only.
