No. 9.

Resolution in relation to the Members' Newspapers, &c. Passed Feb] 5, 1847.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the State pay to George G. Brewer, chief clerk of the House of Delegates, and Joseph H. Nicholson, chief clerk of the Senate, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the amount of the several accounts that may, from time to time, be presented to him by said clerks for newspapers furnished the members of the Legislature during the present session; and that he also pay the amount for postage upon letters forwarded and received by said clerks, relative to the duties of their respective offices.

No. 10.

Resolution in favor of Isaiah Hood.

Passed Feb. 5, 1847.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer pay to Isaiah Hood, the balance of any pension due on the books of the treasury to Kitty Hood, at the time of her death.

No. 11.

Resolutions in relation to the building of a Light House on Drum Point.

Passed Feb] 3, 1847.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That our Senators and Representatives in Congress be requested to use their efforts in procuring an appropriation for building a Light House on Drum point, at the mouth of the Patuxent harbor, on the Chesapeake bay.

Resolved, further, That His Excellency the Governor be requested to forward a copy of said resolution to our Senators and Representatives in the Congress of the United States.
