Resolution in relation to the salary of the President of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company. Passed March 10, 1847.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the States' agents are hereby instructed to vote at the next meeting of the stockholders of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, for the reduction of the salary of the president of the said company, to the sum of one thousand dollars, at which rate the said salary shall continue to be paid until such time as active operations for the completion of the said canal shall be resumed.

Resolution directing the Treasurer to cause to be published the acts of Assembly relating to the General Revenue. Passed March 10, 1847.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to cause to be published in two papers, printed in the city of Baltimore, and one German paper, and one paper in Howard District, and in each county where a newspaper is printed, such acts passed by the General Assembly as provide for the general revenue of the State, and the said Treasurer be authorised to pay for said publication, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.
