Resolution in favor of John G. Hetzell, Daniel Caulk and Walter McNeir. Passed March 10, 1847.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the State, pay to John G. Hetzell, the sum of three hundred and twenty-five dollars and thirty-seven cents, for tinning the roof of the State House, and also to Caulk and McNeir, the sum of fifty-six dollars, being the amount due them for work done on roof of State House.

Resolution in favor of William Fisher.

Passed March 10, 1847.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer pay William Fisher, or his order, for stationary furnished the Library, the sum of three hundred and seventy-nine dollars and thirty-two cents, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

Resolution in favor of Dennis C. Thompson.

Passed March 10, 1847.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the State be, and he is hereby authorized to pay to Dennis C. Thompson, the sum of twelve dollars, for his services as assistant committee clerk in the Senate, employed by authority of the honorable the President thereof.
