**INQUESTS**—Where jury is convened by coroner or justice of the peace, acting as coroner on dead body, etc., whereon marks of violence appear; jurors, also coroners or justice to require the attendance of a physician to testify, after examination, etc., before said jury ect. 168 1

    On refusal or neglect of physician to attend, etc., to be fined in the same manner as any other person refusing, etc., after being summoned, etc. “ 2

    Account to be made out by coroner, etc., and furnished to levy court etc., sum for remuneration of physician to be included, etc., not less than five dollars, nor exceeding ten dollars, to be levied in next levy, etc. “

**INSPECTION OF LUMBER AND SHINGLES AT PORT DEPOSIT**—The Governor, &c., to appoint ten measurers, &c., of, at Port Deposit; said measurers to be entitled to one deputy, resident of Maryland, to be governed by same laws which govern inspectors of, in Baltimore; to be allowed 25 cents for every 1,000 feet reduced measure of lumber; 12½ cents for every 1,000 shingles, one
