CHAPTER 66.

An act for the incorporation of Pledge Division Number Passed Feb. 19, 1847. Twelve, Sons of Temperance.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Incorporated. Maryland, That Samuel Eichelberger, Eli Mobley, Samuel M. King, Thomas G.
