Passed Feb 25, 1847.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, In cases where That in any cause, dispute or matter in the Land Office, Chancellor is usually cognizable by the Chancellor as Judge of the same shall be Land Office, in which the Chancellor for the time being heard by Chief Third may have been counsel, or have given his opinion, or Judge Third may be interested, or related to the parties interested, trict, &c. and on that account may conceive that he cannot conscientiously act thereon, and shall so certify in writing, the same shall be heard by the Chief Judge of the Third Judicial District, or one of the Associate Judges thereof, or by the court thereof, at the election of any party to such cause, dispute or matter, and all interlocutory and other orders in such cases shall be made by the said Chief Judge, or Associate, or court, which orders shall have the same effect as if made by the Chancellor in his capacity as Judge of the Land Office.
