CHAPTER 129.

*An act to divorce Benjamin Sunderland, of the City of Baltimore, from his wife Mary Sunderland.* Passed Feb. 26, 1848.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Divorced.  
That the marriage contract heretofore had and solemnized between Benjamin Sunderland, of the city of Baltimore and Mary Sunderland, be and the same is hereby declared to be henceforth and forever null and void, and the said parties are hereby declared to be divorced a vinculo matrimonii.

CHAPTER 130.

*An act to divorce Sarah Price, from her husband John Price, of Somerset County.* Passed March 1, 1848.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Divorced.  
That the marriage contract heretofore had and solemnized between Sarah Price and John Price of Somerset county, be and the same is hereby declared to be henceforth and forever null and void, and the said parties are hereby declared to be divorced a vinculo matrimonii.

CHAPTER 131.

*An act for the relief of George W. Wilson.* Passed March 2, 1848.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Time extended.  
That the time of George W. Wilson, late collector of Prince George's county, to complete his collections, is hereby extended two years from the passage of this act.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* To annex affidavit to account.
