CHAP. 167.

Passed
March 2, 1848.

An act to allow Benjamin Swingley, former Collector of Taxes in Washington County, further time to complete his collections.

Time extended
to collect.

SECTION. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Benjamin Swingley, late collector of State and county taxes for the year eighteen hundred and forty-three, and county taxes for the year eighteen hundred and forty-four, in Washington county, be and he, or his agents or attornies are hereby authorised to collect any and all taxes or balances of taxes due him or them and now remaining uncollected for the several years in which he was collector of the taxes in said county, in the same manner and with the same privileges and powers he could or might have done within the time limited by law.

In force.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the authority hereby given shall continue until the first day of June eighteen hundred and forty-nine.

CHAPTER 166.

Passed
March 3, 1848.

An act entitled, an act to abolish the Office of Cryer to the Orphans Court, of Washington County.

Abolished.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, the office of cryer to the orphans court of Washington county, be and the same is hereby abolished.

CHAPTER 167.

Passed
March 3, 1849.

An act for the relief of Leonard Sine, of Preston County, Virginia.

Levy authorized
for his support.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of Allegany county are empowered and authorised to levy thirty dollars, on the assessable property of said county, for the use of Leonard Sine.
