CHAPTER 174.

An act to alter and change the name of William Lemuel Bateman, of the city of Baltimore.

Name changed.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the name of William Lemuel Bateman, a citizen of Maryland, and a resident of the city of Baltimore, be and the same is hereby altered and changed to William Thomas Henry Worthington, and it shall be lawful for the said William Thomas Henry Worthington at all times hereafter to be called and known by, and hold and use the name of William Thomas Henry Worthington, and by that name shall have the right to purchase, sell, convey, devise or receive by bequest any property hereafter devised, to sue and be sued in any court of law and equity.

A further supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the division of the City of Baltimore into twenty wards, and for other purposes.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, doubts are entertained whether, in the language used in the supplementary act, passed fourth of March, eighteen hundred and forty-six, relating to the election of members of the second branch of the city council of Baltimore, an alteration of the day of election of said members from the second Wednesday of October is not made, and which was not designed but only to prescribe the tenure of said members and to provide for their election biennially—Therefore,
