CHAP. 219.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the aforesaid Thomas Sater shall, in every instance before he may proceed to the aforesaid collection, make affidavit before some justice of the peace of Carroll county, that the same remains unpaid, and that he hath not received any security or satisfaction for the same or any part thereof, more than what credit or credits may be allowed thereon.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall not continue in force longer than one year from the first day of June next after the passage of this act.

CHAPTER 218.

*An act to divorce Richard Thomas, from his wife Susanna Thomas.*

Passed March 8, 1848.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the marriage contract heretofore had and solemnized between Richard Thomas of Cecil county, and his wife Susanna Thomas, be and the same is hereby declared to be henceforth and forever null and void, and the said parties are hereby declared to be divorced a vinculo matrimonii.

CHAPTER 219.

*An act authorising and directing the Commissioners of the School Fund for Queen Anne's County, to pay over to the Trustees of the Centreville Academy, a certain portion of said fund upon conditions therein named.*

Passed March 8, 1848.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That from and after the passage of this act the commissioners of the school fund for Queen Anne's county be and they are hereby authorised and required to pay unto the trustees of the Centreville Academy such proportion of the school fund for said county as the
