An additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Mutual Insurance Company of Carroll County.

Revived.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the act to incorporate the Mutual Insurance Company of Carroll county, passed at December session eighteen hundred and forty-five, chapter two hundred and ninety, be and the same is hereby revived and put in full force and virtue as a law.

Election of directors.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the first named twelve persons in the first section of the act to which this is a supplement, shall be the directors of said company until the first Monday of May eighteen hundred and forty-eight, at which time, and annually thereafter, twelve directors shall be elected for the purposes, and in the manner, and with the restrictions as set forth in the second section of the original act to which this is a supplement, and the constitution required to be prepared in said second section, shall be submitted on the first Monday of April eighteen hundred and forty-eight.

Time of publishing annual statement

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the last Monday in April eighteen hundred and forty-nine, and annually thereafter, shall be the time for the directors to publish their statement, as required in the sixteenth section of the original act to which this is a supplement.

An act to incorporate the Philadelphia Mining Company.

Name and style.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That James Hall, Thomas Morey and Jeremiah Myers, and such other persons as may be associated with them in the manner hereinafter prescribed, shall be and they are hereby incorporated by the name of the Philadelphia Mining company, and as such shall have succession, and may have and use a common seal, and be able and capable to sue and be sued, plead or be impleaded in any court of law or equity, and may also have, use, exercise and enjoy all the rights, powers and privileges proper and necessary for carrying on the manufacture of iron and of articles of which
