SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Mode of appointment of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, the Librarian some qualified person shall be appointed by the con-changed. current vote of the Senate and House of Delegates of this State as Librarian, who previous to entering upon the duties of his office, shall give bond to the State of Maryland, in such sum and with such security as the committees of the said Senate and House on the library approve, with condition as prescribed in the third section of the act to which this is a supplement.

And be it futher enacted, That in ease of the death, disqualification, resignation or removal from the how to be filled State of the librarian, during the recess of the General Assembly, the Governor of the State shall fill such vacancy, and the person so appointed shall continue in office until the next meeting of the General Assembly, giving bond and security as aforesaid, to be approved of
