No. 6.

Resolution in relation to certain repairs upon the Government House.

Passed
Jan. 12, 1849.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay out of any unappropriated money in the treasury to the Governor or his order, any sum not exceeding three thousand dollars, to be applied by him so far as he may deem necessary in repairs and for the purchase of furniture for the Government House.

No. 7.

Resolution in relation to certain repairs of the room in the occupancy of the Adjutant General, to be used for the accommodation of the standing committees of the Senate.

Passed
Jan. 12, 1848.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the room now in the occupancy of the Adjutant General of Maryland be repaired by the removal of the shelves below the gallery, and be painted as soon as practicable, under the direction of the Adjutant General, and that he cause furniture to be procured necessary for the accommodation of the standing committees of the Senate, and the room when so prepared be placed under his care and control.

Resolution authorising the Librarian of the State to subscribe for one hundred and fifty copies of Norris, Brown and Brune's Digest of the Decisions of the Court of Appeals of Maryland.
