Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the committee on Claims be and they are hereby authorised and directed to pay out of any monies in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Albert T. Emory, Deputy Attorney General of Queen Anne's county, a reasonable compensation for the services which he rendered to the State before the Orphan's Court of said county, in certain cases arising upon the settlement of the estate of Lemuel Parnell, late of said county, deceased, in which several important principles were involved, and from which the State realized a considerable sum of money.
