CHAPTER 56.

Passed
Feb. 5, 1848.

An act entitled, an act to allow D. H. Hooper of the State of Mississippi, to bring into this State, a negro woman named Ann, a slave for life.

Authorised to
bring slave in-
to this State.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That D. H. Hooper of the State of Mississippi, be and he is hereby authorised to bring into this State a negro woman named Ann, a slave for life, from the State of Mississippi; provided, he pay the colonization tax as provided by the act of eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, chapter fifteen.

CHAPTER 57.

An act to change the name of the Lulworth Iron Company.

Name chang-
ed, &c.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, that the name of the Lulworth Iron company shall be, and is hereby changed to that of the Mount Savage Iron Company, with power and authority by that name, to have, exercise, hold and enjoy, use and possess, all the property now held by the Lulworth Iron Company, and which may hereafter be acquired by said company by its new name, and with power and authority, by that name, to hold and use the rail road purchased by the said Lulworth Iron Company, leading from the town of Cumberland to the mines and works of the said company at the Mount Savage Iron Company in Allegany county, in the same manner, and with the same rights and privileges, and subject to the same conditions of connecting therewith, as are conferred and prescribed by the act incorporating the Lulworth Iron Company, passed at December session eighteen hundred and forty-six, chapter two hundred and ninety-seven, concerning rail roads.
