Resolution in favor of John T. Jackson and others.

Passed
March 8, 1848.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of this State pay unto John T. Jackson the sum of thirty dollars for services rendered as clerk to the select committee appointed by this House to ascertain the fees and emoluments arising from certain offices in Baltimore city and county;

Unto Louis Servary, the sum of sixteen dollars, for four days attendance as witness before said committee;

Unto John Berryman, the sum of eight dollars, for two days attendance as witness before said committee;

Unto Augustus W. Bradford, the sum of twenty-eight dollars, for seven days attendance as witness before said committee;

Unto John J. Graves, the sum of eight dollars, for two days attendance as witness before said committee;

Unto Nicholas Tracy, the sum of eight dollars, for two days attendance as witness before said committee;

Unto John Kettlewell, the sum of eight dollars, for two days attendance as witness before said committee;

Unto Philip Reigart, the sum of eight dollars, for two days attendance as witness before said committee;

Unto William H. Gatchell, the sum of fifty-two dollars, for thirteen days attendance as witness before said committee;

Unto William M. Medcalf, the sum of eight dollars, for two days attendance as witness before said committee;

Unto J. Thompson Laws, the sum of four dollars, for one day's attendance as witness before said committee;

And unto Dennis C. Thompson, the sum of forty-four dollars, for eleven days acting as clerk to the special committee.
