Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commanding officers of the several military divisions, brigades, regiments and companies in State of Maryland, be and they are hereby ordered and required to enrol or meanse to be enrolled, their several and respective com-BIEL OF TAM DEMands, on or before the fourth day of July next, and report return of the same to the Adjutant General of Maryland, on or before the first day of September next.

Resolved, That the name of any militia officer of this State failing to comply with the above requisitions, shall be stricken from the roll of military appointments in this
