CHAPTER 130.

An act to allow William Delahay, late Sheriff of Caroline County, further time to complete his Collections. Passed Feb. 12 1850.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Time extended
That the time limited by law within which William Delahay, late sheriff of Caroline county, shall have made his collections, be and the same is hereby extended to the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three.

CHAPTER 131.

An act for the relief of William J. Leonard, of Worcester County. Passed Feb 18, 1850

WHEREAS, Isaac Mills, late of the State of Delaware, Preamble.
removed into this State, bringing with him a certain negro woman, and failed, within the time prescribed by law, after the removal of the said negro into this State, to comply with the acts of Assembly, of eighteen hundred and thirty-three, chapter eighty-seven, in such case made and provided; and whereas, the said Mills afterwards sold the said negro to William J. Leonard—
Therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Made valid
That, after the passage of this act, any defect in the title of the said William J. Leonard, in and to said negro, by reason of the failure of the said Mills to comply with the acts of Assembly in such case made and provided, is hereby cured, and the title of the said William J. Leonard, in and to said negro, is hereby confirmed; provided, the said William J. Leonard shall, within Proviso
thirty days after the passage of this act, comply with all the stipulations of the said act of Assembly, and not otherwise.
