

and every legal voter, at said election, shall be asked by CHAP. 163. the judges of election whether he is for the school tax or against the school tax, and the said judges are required to note and record the answer of each legal voter, and if it shall appear, on comparing the votes, that a majority of the legal votes cast are in favor of levying said tax, then the provisions of this act shall be in full force, otherwise no portion thereof, save the provisions of this section, shall be operative.

CHAPTER 162.

*An act for the relief of Isaac Smith, an Indigent Person, of Calvert County.* Passed Feb. 28, 1850.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Levy authorised. That the Levy Court of Calvert county, are hereby authorised and required to levy upon the assessable property of said county, the sum of thirty dollars annually, for the use of the said Isaac Smith, which said sum shall be placed in the hands of some discreet person of said county, and by him so paid out as to contribute to the interest and support of the said Isaac Smith.

CHAPTER 163.

*An act to allow William Ireland, late Collector of Calvert County, further time to complete his collections.* Passed Feb. 28, 1850.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly* Authorised to of Maryland, That William Ireland, late collector of collect taxes for Calvert county, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to collect any taxes, or balances of taxes now remaining due to, and uncollected by him, in the county aforesaid, in the same manner and with the same power and privileges as are allowed by the existing laws in cases made and provided.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall not In force.
