CHAPTER 174.

An act entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed Fassed Feb 27, at December session, eighteen hundred and forty-six, 1850. chapter fifty-one.

SECTION I. Be it enacted by the General Assembly Compensation of Maryland, That the trustees of the poor of Bal-of trustees of timore county, be allowed one dollar each per day, and poor five cents a mile, going to and from, for such days as they may respectively attend at the Alms House, in accordance with the rules of that institution, regulating the days on which visits shall be made.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the said trustees Retrospective of the poor shall be allowed respectively, one dollar per operation day, and five cents a mile, going to and from said institution, for such days as they may have attended at the Alms House, subsequently to the passage of the act to which this is a supplement.
