 SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the polls for the new district, designated and bounded as aforesaid, shall be opened and held at the Horse Head, within the limits of said district.

CHAPTER 227.

Passed Feb. 27, 1850 *An act to allow John Simpvers, late Collector of Cecil County, further time to complete his collections.*

Time extended SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That John Simpvers, late collector of taxes in the fifth election district of Cecil county, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to collect any and all taxes now remaining due and uncollected by him in the county aforesaid, in the same manner and with the same privileges and powers he could or might have done within the time limited by law.

Make oath. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said John Simpvers shall, in every instance, before he proceeds to collect any taxes, or balances of taxes, under and by virtue of this act, make affidavit before some justice of the peace in said county, that the same remains unpaid, and that he has not received any part or parcel of the same, or security or satisfaction therefor, other than what may be credited thereon.

In force. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall not continue in force longer than two years, and shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 228.

Passed Feb. 22, 1850. *An act for the benefit of John Curtis, late Sheriff and Collector of Somerset County.*

Time extended SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That John Curtis, late Sheriff of Somerset county, by himself or any other person or persons by him appointed for this purpose, is and are
