order and repair; *provided*, that the said lot shall not be so located as to interfere with the yards, gardens, orchards or buildings of any person or persons.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners shall cause to be made out a plat of the lot of ground so surveyed, located and condemned, to be lodged in the clerk's office of Dorchester county, there to remain in perpetual testimony of the aforesaid survey, location and condemnation.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners or a majority of them, shall value and assess the damages sustained by any person or persons, whose land may be affected by said survey, location or condemnation, and make return thereof, together with all the necessary expenses attendant on said survey, to the commissioners of the tax for the said county.

SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted*, That the commissioners of the tax for Dorchester county are hereby authorised and required to levy upon the taxable property of said county, the amount of damages and expenses incurred under this act, and direct the same to be paid over to the person or persons legally and rightfully entitled thereto.

CHAPTER 308.

*An act to divorce Francis M. Deems, of Allegany County, from his wife Parmelia Deems.* Passed March 5, 1850.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Francis M. Deems, of Allegany county, be and he is hereby divorced from his wife Parmelia Deems, a vinculo matrimonii.
