Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assem-Time extended bly of Maryland, That it shall and may be lawful for John S. Ensor, former collector of tax of said county, to proceed in the collection of all arrearages of tax placed in his hands for collection, according to existing tax laws, and in as full and ample a manner as if said taxes had been collected in the respective years as they became due, and he shall have the same power as if he had collected the tax within the year, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the aforesaid col-To make oath lector named in the first section of this act, shall, in every instance, before he shall proceed to the collection of the tax, make affidavit before some justice of the peace of said county, that the same remains unpaid, and that he has not received any security or satisfaction for the same, or any part thereof, more than what credits may be given.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That this law shall be in in force. force for two years after its passage, and no longer.

An act relating to the School Fund, of Washington Passed March county.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly Interest upon of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this the capital of act, the commissioners of the county of Washington, be punctually shall require the interest upon the capital of the school padfund of said county to be punctually paid, and should any person or persons, body politic or corporation, neglect or refuse to pay the interest as aforesaid, upon such amount of said fund as may have been loaned to him, her, or them, the commissioners aforesaid shall cause the amount due from such person or persons, body politic or corporation, both principal and interest, to be collected in the most summary manner.
