Funds—how
invested

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That whenever any of the aforesaid school fund shall have been collected as provided for by the first section of this act, the county commissioners aforesaid shall cause the same to be invested in the stock of the State of Maryland, or some other well secured stock, for the use of the school commissioners of the county aforesaid, and the president of the school fund of said county, shall, in the annual report required to be made by the act of December session, eighteen hundred and forty-one, chapter one hundred and thirty-eight, report also the amount of capital fund upon which the interest may be due and in arrears.

CHAPTER 335.

Passed Mar. 6, 1850. *An act to authorise Decatur H. Miller, of the city of Baltimore, to bring into this State a certain Negro Slave therein mentioned.*

Authority to
bring slave into
this State

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for Decatur H. Miller, of Baltimore city, to bring into this State, from the State of Virginia, a negro man named Hamlin, a slave for life; *provided*, the said Decatur H. Miller comply with the provisions of the act passed December session, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, chapter sixty-one.

CHAPTER 336.

Passed Mar 6, 1850. *An act authorising the Levy Court, of Kent County, to cause a County Wharf to be built at Turner's Creek.*

To erect wharf

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the levy court of Kent county, be and they are hereby authorised to levy upon the taxable property of said county, a sum of money sufficient to pay the expense of building a county wharf at Turner's
