CHAPTER 344.

Passed Mar. 2, 1850. *An act to Divorce Emily Collins, of the City of Baltimore, from her husband, James C. Collins.*

Divorced. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Emily Collins, of the city of Baltimore, be and she is hereby divorced from her husband, James C. Collins, a vinculo matrimonii.*

CHAPTER 345.

Passed Mar. 6, 1850. *An act to Divorce James Billingslea, of Harford county, from his wife, Martha G. Billingslea.*

Divorced. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That James Billingslea, of Harford county, be and he is hereby divorced, a vinculo matrimonii, from his wife Martha G. Billingslea.*

CHAPTER 346.

Passed Feb 21, 1850. *An act to provide for the taking the sense of the People upon the expediency of calling a Convention to frame a new Constitution and Form of Government for this State, and to provide for the election of Delegates to such Convention.*

Sense of the people to be taken as to the call of a State Convention, etc

SECTION I. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That for the purpose of ascertaining the sense of the people of this State, as to the expediency of calling a Convention of Delegates, to be elected by the people, to frame a new Constitution and Form of Government, except so far as regards the rights and relations existing between master and slave, as now established and sanctioned by the Constitution and Form of Government of this State, it is hereby recommended to the legal voters of the State, that on the second Wednesday in May next, and at the same places where county and city elections are now held, that every person entitled to vote in the election of*
