May establish bye-laws Proviso

SEC. 3. Ind be it enacted, That this corporation shall have power to make bye-laws, and the same to alter and amend at their pleasure; provided, they do not conflict with the laws of the State of Maryland, the laws of the United States, or the laws of the Grand Division of the Sons of Temperance of the State of Maryland.

In force, &c.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That this act of incorporation shall enure for forty years from its passage, and that the Legislature reserves to itself the right to alter and amend this act of incorporation at pleasure.

Banking forbid

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That nothing in this act be construed so as to authorise the said corporation to issue any note, token, device, scrip, or other evidence of debt, to be used as a currency.

Passed March An act for the relief of Edward Guest, Richard G. 5, 1850. Guest, John W. Guest, and Sally Guest.

Guest, Richard S. Guest, Job W. Guest and Sarah E. Guest, a certain tract or part of a tract of land called Tanner's Hill, lying and being situate in Worcester county, Maryland, but from an error of the parties, the deed given for the same was recorded among the records of Accomac county court, in the State of Virginia, as a reference to the said record will more fully show—Therefore.
