

CHAP. 417. as may be necessary and proper to comply with the terms of said subscriptions.

To erect toll-gate and charge toll

SEC. 15. *And be it enacted,* That the said company having perfected said road, or such parts thereof, according to the intention of said act, it shall and may be lawful for them to erect gates or pikes across said road, and to appoint such and so many toll-gatherers as they shall think proper to collect and receive of and from any person or persons using said road, the tolls and rates per mile according to the length of the road as are charged and collected at the toll-gates of the Boonsboro' turnpike road company, and to stop any person, riding, leading or driving any horses, mules, oxen, sheep, hogs, sulkey, chair, chaise, phaeton, coach, coachee, stage, cart, wagon, wain, sleigh, sled or any other carriage of pleasure or burden, from passing through the said gates until the toll for the said passage shall have been paid; *provided,* that no toll-gate shall be erected within one mile of Boonsboro' or any other town or village, through which said road may pass.

Proviso

Banking forbid

SEC. 16. *And be it enacted,* That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to allow said company to issue any note, token, scrip, certificate or other evidence of debt to be used as a currency, and the legislature reserves to itself the right to alter or repeal this act of incorporation at pleasure.

CHAPTER 417.

Passed Mar. 7, 1850. *An act to encourage the destruction of Foxes, in Washington County.*

Allowance for destroying foxes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That from and after the passage of this act, every person who is an actual resident of Washington county, shall be entitled to an allowance from said county, not to exceed one dollar, for every fox destroyed or killed by him or her.

To make oath.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That it shall be necessary for the person so killing or destroying any fox or foxes, to produce the head and tail of the same before some justice of the peace in and for said county, to make oath or affirmation, that the said fox or foxes was taken, wounded or killed within the limits of the county
