CHAPTER 423.

An act for the relief of John W. Wilburn, Collector Passed Mar. 7, of the County and State Tax, for Calvert County. 1850.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly May collect. of Maryland, That John W. Wilburn, collector of the State and county tax for Calvert county, be and he is hereby authorised to proceed to collect all taxes that may be due him for the years, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and forty-six, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Wilburn, before he proceeds to collect the aforesaid given. taxes, in virtue of this act, shall deliver, or cause to be delivered to such person or persons, from whom such taxes are due, a notice, which notice shall be given at least thirty days before he proceeds to act.
