An act for the benefit of the wife and children of Passed Mar 9.

Isaac Downes, a deceased colored man, of Caroline

County.

Whereas, it is represented to this General Assembly, Preamble.

That a certain Isaac Downes, colored man, of Caroline county, departed this life, some years ago, leaving real property, namely: a house and lot, consisting of two or three acres, and leaving a wife and children, who under the laws of this State, are incompetent to inherit the same—Therefore.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly May hold proper of Maryland, That the wife and children of the said erty. Isaac Downes, be and the same are hereby made capable of taking the said property, subject to the provisions of the act regulating descents, in this State.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That nothing Exemption in said act, regulating descents in this State, or any other acts which incapacitates free negroes from inheritants, shall apply the wife and children of the said Isaac Downes.
