An act to allow John R. Baden, former Sheriff of Passed Mar. 9, Prince George's county, further time to complete his 1850. collections.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly Time extended of Maryland, That John R. Baden, late sheriff of Prince George's county, by himself, or any person or persons by him appointed for that purpose, is and are hereby authorised and empowered to collect all fees, fines, forfeitures, balances of money due him, as late sheriff of said county, in the same manner, and to the same extent, which he could or might have done within the time limited by law.

SEC. 2. And be ut enacted, That the said John R. Oath required Baden, before he proceeds to collect under and by virtue of this act, shall make out and deliver the person or persons from whom any fees, fines, forfeitures and balances of money may be demanded, an account of the same as due by the person or persons from whom the same are
