CHAPTER 85.

CHAP. 87.

A supplement to the act of eighteen hundred and forty-seven, chapter ninety-four. Passed Feb. 7, 1850.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Time extended
That Thomas H. Ford shall have and exercise, until the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty-three, all the powers, privileges and authority given to and conferred upon him, in and by the act, entitled, an act to authorise and empower Thomas H. Ford to complete the collections of Andrew Johnson, deceased, late Sheriff of Queen Anne's county, and to give him further time to do so, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and forty-seven, and that this act shall take effect from and after its passage.
