SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly Abolished of Maryland, That from and after the first Wednesday in October, eighteen hundred and fifty, the levy court of Prince George's county, be and the same is hereby abolished.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That on the first Wedness Commissioners day of October next, and on the first Wednesday in October, every third year thereafter, all persons in Prince George's county, entitled to vote for delegates to the General Assembly, shall vote, by ballot, in their several election districts, for seven persons to be nominated and
