Resolutions directing the Librarian to transmit to the Maryland Historical Society, copies of certain Laws. Passed Feb 27,  
1850.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,*  
That the State Librarian, be and he is hereby authorised and required to transmit to the Maryland Historical Society, and also to every public library in the State, as soon after each session of the Legislature, as they may be ready for distribution, one copy of the laws passed at said session, one copy of the journal of each House of the General Assembly, and one copy of the printed documents of said session.

*Resolved,* That the said Librarian, be and he is hereby authorised and required to transmit to said society, and also to every public library in the State, at his earliest convenience, one copy of the laws passed at December session, eighteen hundred and forty-six, and one copy of the laws passed at December session, eighteen hundred and forty-seven.
